Spectrum in Movement: An Exploration through the Animated Lens was a three-month-long art exhibit with pieces created by Spectrum for Living clients. Through the support of the Middlesex County Arts and History Grant Program, this artistic exhibition was an exercise in animation, digital creation, and creative expression. Throughout the education phase of the project, clients learned the basics of storyboarding, illustration, integration, and video rendering. Their animations were created through coloring, shading, and adding texture to landscape illustrations. Upon the completion of each client's piece, our Arts Team worked in tandem with our artists to help identify common elements among all of their pieces to create a cohesive rendered video.
